I find the post cor. to sees. 3, 4, 9 end 10 lying upon the ground, considerably decayed, marked T 30 S S 3 on NE., R 9 W S 10 on SE., S 9 on SW and S 4 on NW faces with 5 notches on S and 3 notches on E edges.

I find all the witness trees. At cor point, I set a stone, 14x12x12", 10" in the ground for cor, to secs. 3, 4, 9 & 10, marked with 5 notches on S and 3 notches on E edges, from which

A Fir, 36" dia., bears N.56°E., 32 lks., marked T30S R9W S3 BT.  
A Fir, 10" dia., bears S.75°E., 41 lks., marked T30S R9W S10 BT.  
A Fir, 20" dia., bears S.20°W., 35 lks., marked T30S R9W S9 BT.  
A Fir, 30" dia., bears N.14°W., 38 lks., marked T30S R9W S4 BT.

These trees are all marked in the bark & cannot be distinctly seen. I remark them in the wood as follows

A Fir, 36" dia., bears N.56°E., 32 lks., marked T30S R9W S3 BT.  
A Fir, 10" dia., bears S.75°E., 41 lks., marked T30S R9W S10 BT.  
A Fir, 20" dia., bears S.20°W., 35 lks., marked T30S R9W S9 BT.  
A Fir, 30" dia., bears N.14°W., 38 lks., marked T30S R9W S4 BT.
