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Found - A stone firmly set top measures 12"x4" protruding 5" above ground.  
18" now 15" dia., 15 ft tall D.Fir snag with a fully healed upper blaze, the scribing "BT" is visible on lower bark scribed blaze bears N.23°E., 21.5 ft. (rec. N.23°E., 21.8 ft. is a slope distance)  
14" now 16" dia., down and rotted D.Fir, scribing is found "W" bears S.83°W., 9.2 ft. (agrees with record)

New - Position of stone is referenced and a 2 3/8" dia., DCSO brass cap on a 1½" O.D. by 32" long iron pipe is set at referenced position, protruding 6" above ground. Brass cap mkd:

4"x12"x20" stone is set along north edge of DCSO BC/IP protruding 6" above ground.  
22" dia., I.Cedar is double blazed and scribed "W 1/16 S12 CS BT" bears N.70°E., 48.8 ft.  
4" dia., D.Fir double blazed and scribed "X BT" bears N.20°W., 18.7 ft.  
9" dia., D.fir double blazed and scribed "W 1/16 S13 CS BT" bears S.59°E., 20.0 ft.  
10" dia., D.Fir double blazed and scribed "W 1/16 S13 CS BT" bears S.50°W., 36.5 ft.
