Set a stone 20x12x8 ins., 15" in the ground for ¼ sec. cor. marked ¼ on N. face; from which

A Fir 6" dia., bears N.41½°W., 21½ lks. dist. mkd. ¼ S BT

A Yew 6" dia., bears S.50°E., 8½ lks. dist. mkd. ¼ S BT.

Found - Orig. 20" x 12" x 8" stone, 15" in the ground with faint "¼" on North face.

6" now 24" Fir with well healed blaze bears N.46°W. (Rec. N.41½°W.) 14.2 ft.

6" now 14" Yew with partial scribe visible in partially healed blaze, bears S.53°E. (Rec. S.50°E.) 5.6 ft.

At the location of original stone, I Set a brass cap mkd. "Douglas County Surveyor S23 S26 T31S R3W 1981".

Original stone was placed along southerly side of brass cap. New BTs- 16" Fir bears S.52°W., 12.9 ft. mkd. "¼ S26 CS BT" in double blaze.

8" Fir bears N.6°E., 2.7 ft. mkd. "¼ S23 CS BT" in double blaze.

Found - A 1¼" iron post by G. Quibell, DCSO deputy surveyor in 1981, per C.S. file No. 61/19, firmly set, projecting 6" above the ground with a 2½" brass cap (properly mkd)

From which the original bearing trees by W. Bushey in 1893:

A 24" W.Fir bears N.46°W., 14.5 ft with no marks visible on an open face. (rec. N.46°W., 14.2 ft)

A 14" yew bears S.53°E., 5.5 ft with a healed blaze. (Rec. 5.6 ft)

And bearing trees by G. Quibell in 1981:

A 23" D.Fir bears S.55°W., 12.3 ft with a healed blaze. (Rec. S.52°W., 12.9 ft)

A 12" D.Fir bears N.6°W., 2.4 ft with a healed blaze. (Rec. N.6°E., 2.7 ft)

The orig. 20x12x6" stone is buried 6" south of BCIP.
