A Fir tree, 8" dia., cor. to secs. 11, 12, 13 and 14 mkd. T31S R6W S12 on NE.; S13 on SE.; S14 on SW.; and S11 on NW. faces with 1 notch on E. and 4 notches on S. edges, from which

- A Laurel 12" dia., bears N.72°E., 65 lks. dist. mkd. T31S R6W S12 BT.
- A Fir 10" dia., bears S.45°E., 29 lks. dist. mkd. T31S R6W S13 BT.
- A Fir 10" dia., bears S.60°W., 7 lks. dist. mkd. T31S R6W S14 BT.
- A Laurel 6" dia., bears N.25°W., 22 lks. dist. mkd. T31S R6W S11 BT.

No trace of NW Laurel.

12" now 23" dia., dead madrone with a fully healed blaze, bears N.72°E., 42.9 ft. (agrees well with rec) OBT

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10" now 18" dia., D.Fir shell with down trunk I open blaze & find good scribe mark "S" bears S.47½°E., 19.1 ft. (Rec. S.45°E., 19.1 ft.) OBT
10" now 17" dia., 12 ft. high D.Fir snag with a fully healed blaze bears S.60°W., 4.6 ft. (agrees w/rec) OBT
6" now 15" dia., I.Cedar with a fully healed double blaze bears N.54°W., 25.9 ft. (Agrees w/rec) 1966
10" now 15" dia., dead madrone with illegible scribing visible in a partially healed blaze bears N.22½°E., 36.0 ft. (agrees w/rec) 1966
New - 10" dia., I.Cedar double blazed & scribed "T31S R6W S13 CS BT" bears S.75½°E., 12.4 ft.
9" dia., maple double blazed & scribed "T31S R6W S14 CS BT" bears S.4°W., 12.0 ft.
10" dia., D.Fir double blazed & scribed "T31S R6W S12 CS BT" bears N.19°E., 28.0 ft.
Note - We accept 1966 DCSO BC/IP as corner position. BC/IP position fits closely w/remaining evidence of OBTs
