Set a Cedar post 3 ft. long, 3" sq., 18" in the ground for ¼ sec. cor. marked ¼ S on W. face, from which
A Laurel 14" dia., bears N.75°W., 13 lks. mkd. ¼ S BT.
A Fir 14" dia., bears S.55°E., 17 lks., mkd. ¼ S BT.

Found - 3" x 3" Cedar post, 24" above ground scribed ¼ S11 on West face, ¼ S12 on East face. Post in excellent condition.

34" D.Fir bears S.55°W., 14.0 ft., initials JM chopped into bark. Also bears metal GLO location tag initialed by Murdock and Haines 9-24-46. No visible scars.

Rotted out Fir root collar, bears S.58°E., 11.2 ft.

I do not renew.

Found - 34" now 46" dia., D.Fir with 1946 location tap & chopped initials in bark bears S.55°W., "JM" 14.0 ft. agrees 1974 rec.

New - Set 2½" dia., brass cap on a 1½" dia., by 32" long iron pipe is set at record bearing & distance from 1974 BT. Protrudes 7" out of ground.

8" dia., D.Fir double blazed & scribed "¼ S11 CS BT" bears N.47°W., 22.0 ft.

15" maple double blazed & scribed "¼ S12 CS BT" rootcrown bears N.43½°E., 33.1 ft.
