Set Brass Cap alongside Corner Stone mkd Cap ¼ S29 T31S R8W County Survey-or's office, 1958 S32  
New BTs- 6" R.Fir bears S.30°W. 53.0 ft. scribed ¼ S32 CS BT.  
16" R.Fir bears N.36°E. 47.7 ft scribed ¼ S29 CS BT.

BLM dependent resurvey by Terrence O. Nickerson, Cadastral Surveyor under Group #2004, survey March/Oct. 2002- (DCSO records Vol. 54 Page(s) 21088)  
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The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 29 & 32, perpetuated and recorded by the Douglas County Surveyors Office in 1958, monumented with an iron post, 1" dia., firmly set, projecting 16" above the ground, with brass cap (properly) mkd.  
from which the remains of the original bearing trees  
A fir snag, size indeterminate, bears N.20°E., 11.2 ft. with no visible marks.  
A sugar pine snag, 65" dia., bears S.10°W., 27.1 ft., with healed blaze. (Record, 28.4 ft.)  
and the remains of BTs mkd. by the Douglas County Surveyor  
A sawed red fir stump, 18" dia., bears N.36°E., 47.7 ft., with healed lower blaze.  
An uprooted red fir, 8" dia., bears S.30°W., 53.0 ft., with no visible marks.  
and new bearing trees  
A fir, 10" dia., bears N.60¼ E., 8.7 ft., mkd. ¼ S29 BT.  
A fir, 6" dia., bears S.8¾°E., 9.6 ft., mkd. X at breast height and BT at base.
