<p>A maple, 10" dia., bears S.65°E., 31 lks., with healed blaze. (Record, 35 lks.) A fir, 40" dia., bears S.50°W., 25 lks., with scribe marks T31S R8W S BT visible on bark blaze. (Record, S.55°W.) A fir, 23" dia., bears N.23°W., 38½ lks., with healed blaze. (Record, N.28°W., 45 lks.)</p>

Found -	<p>Brass Cap set by Douglas County A 36" Fir bears S.77½°E. 28.07 ft. (2002 Smalley) A 38" Fir bears S.36°E. 27.37 ft. (2002 Smalley) A 28" Fir bears N.22°W. 24.00 ft. (original) A 42" Fir stump bears S.48¾°W. 17.63 ft. (2002 Smalley) The broken off maple clump is still in existence to the SE</p>
New -	<p>An aluminum post with a BT tag (bearing object) bears S.48¾°W. 14.85 ft.</p>
NOTE -	<p>(we set a spike in the base of the original bearing tree noted above; there are also nails in the two trees scribed by Mark Smalley for measuring distances to the corner; bearings to trees were measured with a total station &amp; are based on the 1977 resurvey of the north line of Section 26) Corner lies on a NW'ly slope above Cow Creek road.</p>
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
