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GLO survey by W.H. Byars under contract #727, dated December 20, 1900 - (DCSO records Vol. 19 Page(s) 8213)

Set a basalt stone, 12x10x5", 8" in ground, marked ¼ on W side for the ¼ sec. cor. from which
A yew, 12" dia., bears N.38°E., 37 lks., mkd: S28 ¼ S BT.
A yew, 6" dia., bears S.85°W., 35 lks., mkd: S29 ¼ S BT.

Found - 4"x4" wooden post rotted at base and unstable protrudes approx. 20" from soil. No record of post is found filed at DCSO. At base of post 2 stones are found one measuring approx. 12x10x5". The other approx. 8x6x5". This crew was not able to discern man-made marks on either stone. (The orig. stone was 12x10x5" and was marked ¼ on west side; a survey crew working for Gerald Riley felt the smaller stone showed evidence of having been marked "¼". This crew was not able to discern such evidence.)

Measurements below taken from center of post.
A 14" DBH D.Fir with an illegible, compound-letter, cruisers mark (at head height), two blaze marks facing north and south (at breast height) and a cruisers mark "I" (Set low on north side of tree). Blaze facing north toward above found monuments is opened, no scribing found on face. This tree bears S.5½°W., 15.7 ft. dist. No record of this tree is found filed at DCSO.
A yew with a double trunk, the northerly trunk measuring 18" DBH and the southerly trunk measuring 8" DBH, has blaze-like scars with openings to heartwood; no scribing or axe marks are found (these scars are possibly caused by old burn in this area) Northerly trunk has what appears to be a remnant of a cruisers mark set high on tree. Scars on southerly trunk are opened; no evidence of a blaze is found. This tree has an updated aluminum tag showing the corner designation and a bearing and distance of S.34°W., 23.2 ft. Also the note "PER HINSON 1946" From the above found monuments this tree bears N.32°E., 23.5 ft. dist. (An orig. 12" yew was recorded as bearing N.38°E., 24.4 ft. No record of an Hinson 1946 survey was fd filed at DCSO.

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The orig. SW BT is searched for but not found. Original call to creek 1 link wide south on section line from quarter corner was a distance of 113.5 ft. Measuring from above found monuments a small Creek is found 133.3 ft. south.
