Set a basalt stone, 16x12x10" 12" in the ground, marked ¼ on W face for the ¼ sec. cor. from which
 A laurel, 10" dia., bears N.52°E., 34 lks. mkd: S2 ¼ S BT.
 A laurel, 16" dia., bears N.24°W., 27 lks. mkd: S3 ¼ S BT.

Found - Orig. 16x12x10" stone with "¼" on W face.
 Orig. 10" now 12" N.32°E., 22.4 ft. (Rec. N.52°E.)
 Orig. 16" Laurel N.29°W., (Rec. N.24°W.) 17.8 ft., shows good scar, rotten center.
Set - Brass cap at ¼ cor. mkd: COUNTY SURVEYORS T31S R9W OFFICE 1967 ¼ S 3|S 2
New BTs- 6" Laurel N.51°E., 14.4 ft. mkd: ¼ S2 CS BT.
 8" Laurel N.77°W., 29.9 ft. mkd: ¼ S3 CS BT.
Note - This corner lies 22.0 ft. south of ridge top.

Found - 1"x30" I.P. with brass cap properly marked attached, lying alongside root wad of a large fir windfall.
 Orig 10" madrone now 12" stump hole w/small portion of the eastern edge of the stump remaining.
 Orig. 16" madrone, now stump with center and face areas gone.
 6" madrone, now 6" snag 4 ft. tall with scribed "¼ S2 CS BT" visible in double blaze. (1967)
 8" madrone now 10' stump with portion of healed over blaze visible. (1967)
Set - I reset the fd. brass cap using all 4 fd. BTs. Stamped "1982" on brass cap.
Bearing & distances used are as follow:
 Orig. 10" madrone, now stump hole bears N.32°E., 22.2 ft. (rec. 22.4 ft.)
 Orig. 16" madrone, now 16" stamp bears N.29°W., 17.4 ft. (17.8')
 6" madrone bears N.50°E., 14.4 ft. (Rec. N.51°E.)
 8" madrone now 10" stump bears N.75°W., 29.9 ft. (Rec. N.77°W.)
Brass cap protrudes approx. 8" out of ground.
New - 7" fir scribed "¼ S3 CS BT" in double blaze bears N.10°W, 39.5 ft.

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Set spike in top of 8" madrone now 10" stump bears
N.75°W,, 29.8 ft. to spike.
48" fir scribed "¼ S2 CS BT" in double blaze bears
