Cor. No. 4, identical with Cor. No. 1 May Queen No. 2 lode, unsurveyed and with Cor. No. 2 of amended location.
A dogwood post, 4.5 ft. long, 5" sq., set 1½ ft. in the ground, scribed M Q 4-792; whence.
A hemlock 6" dia., bears S.70°20'E., 4.8 ft.
A hemlock 10" dia., bears N.58°58'E., 25.40 ft., each blazed and scribed BT M Q 4-792.

May Queen No. 1 Lode Cor. #4 Mineral Survey No. 792 (Sec 9) Found - Orig. 6" hemlock, now a 17" snag, previously opened with scribing "BT MQ 4 792" visible, bearing S.70°20'E., 4.8 ft.
An orig. 10" now 18" hemlock, alive and well-healed, bears N.58°58'E., 25.40 ft.

We set - At the corner point as determined by record bearing & distance from the two fd. orig. BTs as mentioned above, we set a 1"x30" IP 24" in the ground, with brass cap attached mkd:
