A fir post, 4.5 ft. long, 7" sq., set 1½ ft. in the ground scribed T B 3 S P 1 Y K No. 1-2 Y K No. 2-3-792; whence
A fir, 8" dia., bears N.37°18'E., 27.64 ft. and
A fir 4" dia., bears S.59°08'E., 45.9 ft., each blazed and scribed BT T B 3 S P 1 Y K No. 1-2 Y K No. 2-3-792

Found - A 8" now 19" Fir stump bears N.37¼°E., 27.6 ft. with healed chopped open bottom sec. of blaze showing scribing "P 1 792".

A 4" now 14" Fir snag, 12 ft. tall bears S.59°E., 45.9 ft. with healed chopped open double blaze showing faint scribe marks.

Set - A 1"x36" IP with brass cap set 11" above ground mkd:
DOUGLAS COUNTY SURVEYOR T32S R2W
1977 YK No 2-3|SP -1
YK No 1-2|TB -3

I erect a 2 ft. dia., mound of stone to top of cap.
New BTs- A 18 D.Fir bears S.80°E., 39.5 ft. double blazed and scribed "TB 3 SP 1 YK No.1-2 YR No 2-3 792 CS BT"
A 12" D.Fir bears S.6°E., 28.0 ft. double blazed and scribed "TB 3 SP 1 YK No.1-2 YK No 2-3 792 CS BT"
Corner is 8 ft. north of creek.
