Cor. No. 4, identical with Cor. No. 1 North Pole lode, unsurveyed and Cor. No. 4 of amended location.
 A fir post, 4.5 ft. long, 5" sq., set 1½ ft. in the ground scribed B S 4 792; whence
 A fir, 7" dia., bears N.67°25'E., 29.00 ft. and
 A fir, 8" dia., bears S.46°08'W., 14.90 ft., each blazed and scribed BT B S 4-792

Found - No trace of original fir corner post.
 An Orig. 7" D.Fir now a 14" snag with fragmented scribing "79" found on rotten face, bears N.67½°E., 37.4 ft. (Rec. N.67°25'E., 29.00 ft.)
 An orig. 8" now 12" D.Fir alive and in good condition bears S.46°W., 14.90 ft. (Rec. S.46°08'W., 14.90 ft.) we open for verification and find good scribing "92". Growth rings date scribing at approx. 60 years.

Set - At a location which agrees with the previously described bearing trees, We SET a 1"x30" IP 26" in the ground with brass cap attached marked:

New BT - A 15" D.Fir scribed "BS 4 MS 792 CS BT" on a double blaze, S.3°E., 34.3 ft.
 Corner located approx. 10 ft. west of a small creek.
