Mineral Survey No. 792 by C. Frank Rhodes, US Mineral Surveyor under instructions dated July 25, 1916 - (DCSO Recs. Vol. 28 Page(s) 11906)

Cor. No. 1, identical with Cor. No. 2 Hales lode, unsurveyed and Cor. No. 4 Van Ostrand lode, unsurveyed and with Cor. No. 3 of amended location.

A fir post, 15 ft. long, 7" sq., set 1½ ft. in the ground, scribed Y K No. 2-1-792; whence

A laurel, 4" dia., bears S.83°48'E. 17.7 ft. and

A fir, 8" dia., bears N.1°03'W., 44.25 ft., each blazed and scribed BT Y K No. 2-1-792.

The W. ¼ sec. cor. of sec 4. T.32S., R.2W. of W.M., bears S.73°20'W., 1459.2 ft.

Found - No trace of original Fir corner post.

An orig. 4" now 13" Madrone alive with faint scribe mks visible on previously opened rotten face, bears S.76¼°E., 17.7 ft (Rec. S.83°48'E. 17.7 ft)

An orig. 8" now 42" D.Fir alive with faint scar of well healed blaze visible bears N.1°W., 44.25 ft. (Rec. N.1°03'W., 44.25 ft.) We blaze and rescribe this tree "YK 2-1 MS 792 CS BT" on a double blaze along the westerly edge of the scar of the orig blaze.

Set - At a point which agrees with the measurements to the above described orig. bearing tree, We SET a 1"x30" I.P. 28" in the ground on a southwest slope, with brass cap attached marked:
