 Fd. 2 probable BTs, Pine & Fir for bearing & dist. Tree previously opened but fd no scribing. Could have been bark scribed by Byars.
 1/26/1970
 Fd. 2 probable BTs, lg pine stump & D.Fir snag, Fir previously opened. I investigate cor. more w/no results. D.Fir probably bark scribed. Pine stump fd, old axe work probably face but rotted away - ring count does not seem to be old enough.

At the location of the ¼ corner, I found a 50" diam Sugar Pine Stump & a 38" dia. Fir Snag. The Stump had an old yellow tag nailed to the top which stated, "This is a BT". On examining a slab torn from the face of the stump, I found the remains of the top & bottom of a reverse face with old axe marks at the bottom. The center portion of the reverse face was missing. All evidence of bark scribing on the fir snag has been destroyed by axe work.
 On Nov.22,1971, I accompanied James A. Combs, an employee of C & D Lbr Co., to this location. He stated without hesitation that this was the same Sugar Pine Stump that he had seen "BT" scribing on in the period between 1950 & 1955. (See signed statement in file)
 At the position determined by measurement of the orig. dist. from the BTs described above, I set a 2"x36" Iron Pipe, flared at the bottom, with a 3" Brass Cap riveted to the top. The monument projects approx. 10" above the ground.

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From the pipe monument the Orig. BTs. are:
A sugar Pine, 40", now 50" stump, bears N.60°W. 50 lks.
A fir, 30", now 38" snag, bears S.24°E., (Rec. S.40°E.) 13 lks.
I also established New BTs., as follows:
A 32" dia D.Fir bears N.25°W. 46.0 ft. scribed ¼ S5 BT
A 13" dia D.Fir bears S.¾°W. 27.2 ft. scribed ¼ S8 BT.
