Set a Cedar post, 3 ft. long, 4" sq., 24" in the ground for 1/4 sec. corner, marked 1/4 S on N. face; from which
A Fir 24" dia., bears N.51°E., 19 lks. mkd. 1/4 S BT.
A Fir 66" dia., bears S.15°E., 12 lks. mkd. 1/4 s BT.
This corner is on the northern slope of ridge 15 ft below top

The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 9 & 16, perpetuated by the Douglas Co. Surveyor's Office in 1970; monumented with an iron post, 1 1/2" dia., firmly set, projecting 9" above the ground, with brass cap (properly) mkd.
from which the remains of original bearing trees
A fir, 45" dia., bears N.51°E., 12.5 ft., with illegible scribe marks visible on opened blaze.
A sawed fir stump, 60" dia., bears S.15°E., 7.9 ft., with a healed blaze, and scribe marks S16 visible on another blaze, partially healed as scribed by the Douglas County Surveyor's Office.
and a BT mkd. by the Douglas Co Surveyor's Office
A fir, 17" dia., bears N.46 1/4°W., 13.8 ft with healed blaze and a new bearing tree
A fir, 9" dia., bears S.18°W., 42.5 ft., mkd. X at breast height and BT at the base.
Each new BT has a 2 1/2"x 1/4" magnetic nail (Mag Nail) driven at the base on right side center.
