The NE cor. of DLC No. 39, perpetuated from original evidence no longer in existence, by Wenderoth, in 1950, monumented with an iron pipe, 1" dia., bent SW., firmly set, projecting 7" above the ground, with no cap or marks, from which the remains of bearing trees mkd. by Wenderoth:
A decayed oak stump, size indeterminate, bears S.79¼°E., 14.6 ft., with axe marks visible.
A decayed fir stump, 28" dia., bears N.41½°W., 9.5 ft. with axe marks visible.
