A B.Oak 16" dia., bears N.59°W., 53 lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S BT.

CORNER REPORT ONLY  
At 1/4 corner, found a 1/2" I.Pipe in rock pile on ridge from which bears the remains of Black Oak BTs in place at original bearings and distances of the 1881 survey as follows:  
12" B.Oak S.84°E., 18 lks.  
16" B.Oak N.59°W., 53 lks.  
No scribing found. Recognized by Lawrence in his survey, recorded as C.S. File 51/262

Found - 1" pipe outside dia. in mound of large stones.  
Orig. B.Oak remains & stump hole S.84°E., approx. 12 ft. (rec. S.84°E., 11.88 ft.)  
Look for orig. B.Oak at record N.59°W., 24.95 ft. this bearing & distances, falls in old skid road. No stump remains but remains of burned large down B.Oak stem & limbs on ground fallen to the west.  
New - 7" Madrone in clump of 2 trees bears S.78°E., 9.1 ft I bark scribe 1/4 S23 BT & tag.  
11" D.Fir bears S.49°W., 17.1 ft. I bark scribe 1/4 S22 BT & tag.  
13" D.Fir bears N.43°W., 16.9 ft. I bark scribe 1/4 S22 BT & tag.  
11" D.Fir bears N.47°E., 26.8 ft. I bark scribe 1/4 S23 BT & tag.  
Note - Corner lies 1.0 ft. above ground on north-south ridge top. Old skid road approx. 30 ft. west of corner.

The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 22 and 23, perpetuated by Lawrence in 1950-51, from original evidence no longer in existence, utilized by Lawrence in 1963, Brandt in 1978, and further perpetuated by Hoffine in 2004, monumented with an iron pipe, ½" dia., firmly set, projecting 14" above the ground, in a mound of stone, 2 ft. dia., from which BTs mkd. by Hoffine:

A fir, 11" dia., bears N.49°E., 26.8 ft., with scribe marks ¼ S23 BT visible on a partially healed blaze.

A double trunk madrone, the most westerly trunk, 7" dia., bears S.76¼°E., 9.0 ft., with scribe marks ¼ S23 BT visible on bark.

A fir, 12" dia., bears S.51°W., 17.1 ft., with illegible scribe marks visible on a partially healed blaze.

A fir, 14" dia., bears N.41¼°W., 17.1 ft., with illegible scribe marks visible on a partially healed blaze.

At the corner point

Set a stainless steel post, 28" long, 2½" dia., 24" in the ground, directly over the iron pipe, in a collar of stone, with brass cap mkd.

Found - 2007 BLM brass cap and steel pipe marked T32S R6W ¼ S22 S23 as per volume 55 page 21481-21482

12"x4' tall D.Fir stump at record (N.49°E., 26.8') with a healed face. Tag is missing.

18"x4' tall Pacific Madrone stump at rec (S.76¼°E., 9.0) with healed scribe and LONE ROCK TIMBER tag.

18" D.Fir at record (S.51°W., 17.1') with a healed face and LONE ROCK TIMBER tag.

20" D.Fir at record (N.41¼°W., 17.1') with a healed face and LONE ROCK TIMBER tag.

Corner monument lies on the east edge of a ridge top with the ridge running south, in a mound of stones, approx. 50' south of a decommissioned dirt surface logging landing. Top of monument is 0.1' above the mound of stones.
