The orig. closing cor. of secs. 1, & 2, bears S.89°51'13"W., 53.29 ft., perpetuated by the Douglas County Surveyor's Office, in 1968, monumented with an iron post, 1½" dia., firmly set, projecting 12" above the ground, with the original stone, 15x10x8", lying loose alongside, mkd. CC on a face, 1 groove on a face, and 5 grooves on another face, brass cap (properly) mkd.
