No evidence of orig. SW & NW BTs remains.
A 10" D.Fir now a 19" dia., D.Fir with a fully healed double blaze; bears S.26°W., 45.0 ft. (as per rec.) 1968
A 24" D.fir now a dead and burned 35" dia., approx. 70 ft. tall D.Fir snag showing a partial blaze scar but with face and scribing burned away; bears S.80½°E., 47.8 ft. (rec. S.85°E., 47.8) No evidence of a tree ever at record bearing, probably an error in notes. 1968
New - Rough stone mound is built up and reinforced BC monument now protrudes 3" above stones.
9" dia., maple scribed "SW 24 BT" on a low blaze (rest of trunk too gnarled to scribe); bears N.15°E., 40.9 ft.
A double trunk live oak, the most northerly 10" dia., trunk of which is scribed "BT" on a low blaze. The C.R.C. of the double trunk bears S.37½°W., 34.7 ft. The scribed trunk has an alum. corner location tag with the marks "2A" scratched on its surface. The tag is grown into tree approx. 4½ft. above ground.
Note - Monument is on very steep and rocky NW slope in an open and recently burned forest of fir, oak and maple.
Compass decl. 15½°E.
