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Set a Laurel post, 4 ft. long, 4" sq., 20" in the ground, for 1/4 sec. cor., marked 1/4 S on N side; from which  
A laurel, 18" dia., bears S.20°W., 6 lks., mkd: 1/4 S BT.  
A laurel, 10" dia., bears N.70°W., 28 lks., mkd: 1/4 S BT.

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Reported as not found.  
Found E-W brushed line quite a group of large laurels but could find nothing to match up, some trees had been opened.

Bruce Shaner - 1/6/96 - M 123-17

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Found - No monument fd.  
18" Laurel (Madrone) BT, original BT, now dead, down & rotten with U.S.B.L.M. bearing tree tag dated Sept. 9, 1951 & posted by "Owen" (Note: other BT's posted by Owen in 1951 were found around sec. 36), bears S.20°W., 4.01'.  
16" Madrone, original BT (rec. Laurel, 10") face rotted & scribes not visible, bears N.70°W., 18.5'. I rescribed on bark "1/4 S25 BT".  
Set- 3" Brass cap on a 2"x30" I.P. in ground.  
New BTs- 32" D.Fir, scribed "1/4 S25 BT", bears N.27°E., 26.8'. this tree has old cruiser mark "W", I have seen several around sec. 36.  
8" D.Fir BT, scribed "1/4 S36 BT" bears S.77°E., 11.3'  
8" D.Fir BT, scribed 1/4 S36 BT", bears S.36°W., 11.8'  
6' steel fence post, bears S.45°W., 1'.  
Corner is west 300' from logging road switchback just to south in sec. 36.
