

PRIMARY CORNER DESCRIPTION Cor. #1, Hard Times M.S.

Alias	Description
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Survey of the Mining Claim of R.C. Shipley, Hard Times Lode

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Set a diorite stone, 28 x 10 x 8 ins., 18" in the ground, and  
in a mound of stone to top, mkd. HT-1-920; from which  
The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 11 and 12, T33S R5W, W.M., Oregon  
bears S.66°57'W., 1529.66 ft. dist., a granite stone,  
10 x 8 ins., firmly set flush with top of ground, mkd.  
¼ on W. face, from which the original bearing trees:  
A D.Fir 36" dia., bears S.54°E., 18 ft. dist., with  
blaze healed.  
An I.Cedar 18" dia., bears N.23½°W., 22.4 ft. dist.,  
with scribe marks ¼ S uncovered.  
Against N. side of stone, set an iron pipe, 3 ft.  
long, 1½" dia., 28" in the ground, mkd. RS33.  
A Yew 6" dia., bears S.58¼°E., 29.0 ft. dist., mkd. HT-1-  
920 BT.  
An Incense Cedar 60" dia., bears S.0°30'E., 9.0 ft. dist.,  
mkd. HT-1-920 BT.  
A corner of the location bears N.69°W., 39.8 ft.

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Found - A diorite stone 28"x10"x8", 18" in ground and in a  
mound of stone. Stone was mkd. "HT-1-920"  
An orig. 6" Yew bears S.58¼°E., 29.0 ft. Tree is  
alive and shows scribing.  
A 60" I.Cedar stump, bears S.0°30'E., 9.0 ft., stump  
shows scribing.  
New BTs -7" Madrone bears S.67°E., 9.2 ft. mkd. "HT-1-920 CS  
BT" in a double blaze.  
We do not set brass cap as orig. stone is well mkd. as per  
record and considering its size, depth in ground, the mound  
of stone surrounding it, and its structural integrity, I  
believe it to be superior to a brass cap as a permanent  
monument.
