N.89*30'E., 7.07 chs. from Cor. No. 2 thereof, hereto-
fore described.

Leave field, bears E. and W.; enter timber and brush.

16.78 Intersect the line bet. secs. 25 and 36, T. 28 S., R. 8 W.,
55 lks. S.89*25'W. from the cor. of secs. 25 and 36,
hereafter described.

18.00 Ten Mile Creek, 40 lks. wide, course E.; leave timber and
brush, bears E. and W.; enter field.

26.00 Point for cor, No. 4 of this survey falls in cultivated
field; impracticable to establish permanent cor.

6.00 Leave field, bears NW. and SE.
