CHAINS

CLAIM NO. 42

Resurvey of Charles Kemuel's Land Claim No. 42 T. 30 S. R. 4 W. in Secs. 8 and 17. Notification No. 140

Begin at the NW. corner, a point 5.00 chns North of the NE cor. of Claim 41. and cor. of Claim 39. The post set for this is gone, the stump of an alder corresponding in size, bearing and distance with the description in the field notes furnished is remaining, but no letters visible; in order to verify its location I go to witness corner of NW. cor. to Claim No. 41, make offset North 4.00 chns, thence East 20.00 chns to line bet. secs. 7 and 8, which I intersected 2245 lks. South of 1/4 sec. post. I restore this cor. by setting a basalt stone 10x7x8, 7 ins. in the ground, marked 42 on SE. face From which

An alder 8 ins. in diam. bears S 7 1/2° E 132 lks. dist. marked T 30 S. R 4 W C. 42 BT. I believe this has grown out of the original tree, only 3 lks. difference.

Thence East bet. Claims 42 and 39.

Va. 19° E.

3.25 Right bank of river, course S 70° W. Set flagg, also set flagg on left bank, cross over, run base S. 250 lks., flagg bears N 18 3/4° W., making 737 lks across.

10.00 Corner in river.

10.62 Left bank of river; cor. and bearing tree are washed away; Set as witness corner 62 lks E. of true cor., a basalt stone 10 x 8 x 8 ins. 7 ins. in the ground, marked 42, W.C. on SE face, and raised a mound of stone alongside. Thence

North, on offset of 62 lks. E. of true line.

1.80 Left bank of S. Umpqua river; course S 70° W.

2.88 Cor. is in the river; Set as witness cor. 108 lks S. and 68 lks. E. of true cor. A basalt stone 9 x 8 x 7 ins. 6 ins. in the ground marked 42 W.C. on SE. face and raised a mound of stone, alongside.

Thence, East from true cor.

Var. 19° E

0.62 Offset South 2.88 chns from true cor.

10.00 Offset North 2.88 chns regained true line, to NE corner of Claim No. 42. The post for this corner is gone, but the bearing tree stands. I restore this corner by setting a basalt stone 20 x 10 x 7 ins., 15 ins. in the ground, marked 42 on SW. face, From which

A Bl. oak 45 ins. in diam. bears N 60° W 1.00 chns dist. marked T 30 S R 4 W C. 39 BT. This is the old bearing tree, whose marks I renew.

Thence, South bet. Claims No. 42 and 43.

Va. 18° 45' E.

20.15 Intersected sec. line bet. 8 and 17 20 chns East of cor. to secs. 7, 8, 17 and 18.

40.50 Leave low bottom, enter a flat rising.
