CHAINS

CLAIM NO. 46

Resurvey of Alexander Dumond's Land Claim No. 46, T. 30 S.  
R. 4 W. in secs. 4, 5, 8 and 9. Notification No. 124.

Begin at the SW cor. exterior angle corner. Here I found a post  
in place, without marks, probably set by the Co. Surveyor; I  
replace this somewhat decayed post and restore corner by  
setting a basalt stone 10 x 8 x 7 ins. 7 ins. in the ground, marked  
46 on NE face, from which

A Wh. oak 12 ins. in diam. bears East 100 lks. dist. marked T30S  
R4W C. 46 BT.

A Bl. oak 16 ins. in diam. bears N. 35° E 84 lks. dist. marked  
T 30 S R 4 W C. 46 BT.

These are the old bearing trees, whose marks, being dim, I renew.  
Stenger house bears S 81° E.

Weaver's house bears S 2 1/4° E.

North on West boundary of Claim No. 46.

Chapman's house bears S 21° W.

Var. 16° 55' E.

Ascend, through oak timber.

3.00 Top of rise, pass along E. slope of hill.

15.00 Var. 18° 45' E.

26.50 Enter fir timber.

28.45 Intersected line betw. sec. 5 and 8, 24.10 chns West of cor. to  
secs. 5, 8, 4 and 9.

Var. 19° 20' E.

45.00 The N. W. corner. The post, set for this cor. is gone, but  
both bearing trees are standing. I restore this corner by setting  
a cedar post, 4 1/2 ft. long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground,  
marked T 30 S R 4 W C. 46 on SE. face, from which

A laurel, 16 ins. in diam. bears N 20° E. 19 lks. dist., marked  
T 30 S R 4 W C. 46. BT.

A laurel, 14 ins. in diam. bears S 25° W. 20 lks. dist., marked  
T 30 S R 4 W C. 46 BT.

These are the original bearing trees, whose marks being dim, I  
renew. Thence

East on North boundary of Claim No. 46.

Var. 18° 35' E.

Descend, through fir and laurel timber.

4.70 A branch 5 lks wide, course S. begin ascent.

18.00 Var. 20° 20' E.
