A Laurel, 9 ins. in diam. bears S 70 1/2° E 33 lks dist. marked  
T 30 S. R 4 W C.47 W.C. BT.

A pine 12 ins. in diam. bears N 403/4°E 30 lks dist. marked  
T 30 S R 4 W C.47 W.C. BT.

The old post, set for this cor. is gone, also the bearing tree;  
but the line tree described in the field notes, namely a black  
oak 14 ins. in diam. is standing, marked with 2 notches on E and  
W sides, which enabled me to find the true line.

Thence East on South boundary of Claim No. 47

Va 19° E.

3.30 Right bank of S. Umpqua river, course N 20° W., enter a low open  
bottom.

9.00 Leave low bottom, ascend to a bench.

10.63 A black oak, 30 ins. in diam.

11.00 Enter a grainfield on bench.

20.00 The South east corner. The old post is gone, and cultivation has  
obliterated all traces on the ground; I proved this cor. by going  
to the 1/4 sec. cor. bet. secs. 10 and 15 and running West 1673  
lks. and S 6.34 chns to this corner. I restore this cor. by set-  
ting a cedar post 4 1/2 ft. long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the  
ground, marked T 30 S R 4 W C.47 on NW. face, from which

An alder 12 ins. in diam. bears N 75 1/4° E 410 lks. dist., marked  
T 30 S R 4 W, C.47 BT.

Thence, North, on East boundary of Claim No. 47.

Va. 19° E.

6.34 Intersected sec. line bet. secs. 10 and 15. 1673 lks west of 1/4  
sec. post.

6.70 Leave grainfield.

10.50 Enter oak openings.

19.08 S.W. corner of Claim No. 48

22.00 Forks of road to Canyonville, course W.

23.00 Enter enclosure, a low bottom with scattering oaks.

36.50 Days Creek, 30 lks wide, course SW.

40.50 Leave pasture, enter grainfield.

58.00 A gravelly knoll.

65.50 Leave same, enter grain.

82.00 Leave field, ascend and enter oak openings.

86.04 N.W. Cor. of Claim No. 48.

86.24 Intersected sec. line bet. secs. 3 and 10. 1920 lks. West of  
1/4 sec. post bet. secs. 3 and 10.
