	<p><u>Claim No. 48</u> cont.</p> <p>old, partly decayed post by setting a cedar post 4 1/2 ft. long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground, marked T 30 S R 4 W C.48 on NW face, from which</p> <p>A fir 33 ins. in diam. bears N 74 1/4° W. 133 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 4 W C.48 BT.</p> <p>Thence, North along East boundary of Claim No. 48.</p> <p>Var. 18° 50' E.</p> <p>Descend N. slope in oak timber.</p>
14.00	Enter prairie, road to Canyonville course W.
26.50	Fate's house bears West; along road.
31.50	Leave road.
32.10	Days Creek 20 lks wide, course W. begin ascent of a slightly ascending grainfield.
36.00	A gully, course S.
46.50	<p>NE. corner; intersect sect. line bet. secs. 3 and 10. 23.30 chns E. of 1/4 sec. cor. Here I found a basalt rock 6 x 8 ins. well buried in the ground, I am informed that this has been put in the place of original post and is considered correct, I find the same to be in true line betw. the NW cor. of Claim 49 and SE cor. of Claim 48 and E & W; I mark the top of the same 48. and dig pit, 24 x 24 x 12 inches and raised a mound along side.</p> <p>Thence, West on North boundary of Claim No. 48.</p> <p>Va. 17° 40' E.</p> <p>Through grainfield, ascending slowly.</p>
23.30	1/4 sec. corner bears North 42 lks.
27.50	Leave grainfield; enter oak openings along S. slope of hill.
42.50	<p>The NW. corner. Found a post in place, probably set by the Co. Surveyor; the same being partly decayed, I replace it by an oak post 4 1/2 ft. long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground, marked T 30 S. R 4 W C.48 on SE. face, from which</p> <p>A Wh. oak 24 ins. in diam. bears S 80° E. 26 lks. dist. marked T 30 S R 4 W C.48 BT. This is the old bearing tree whose marks being dim, I renew.</p> <p>Thence, South bet. Claims No. 47 and No. 48.</p> <p>Va. 18° 5' E.</p> <p>Descend, through oak timber.</p>
8.00	Enter grainfield, bears E & W.
22.50	A gravelly knoll.
30.00	Leave same knoll.
47.50	Leave grainfield, enter pasture.
51.50	Days Creek, 30 lks wide, course SW. Enter low bottom with oak openings.
