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## CHAINS

### CLAIM NO. 49

Resurvey of Franklin O. Worley's Land Claim No. 49. T. 30 S., R. 4 W. in secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11. Notification No. 123.

Begin at the N. W. corner. I found here a post, marked T 30 S. R. 4 W C. 49, lying down; but the bearing tree is standing. I restore the cor. by setting a laurel post 4 1/2 ft. long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground, marked T 30 S. R 4 W. C.49 on SE face, from which

A Bl. oak, 18 ins. in diam. bears S 67° E 32 lks. dist., marked T 30 S. R 4 W C. 49 BT. This is the old bearing tree, whose dim marks, I renew. Thence

South on West boundary of Claim No. 49.

Var. 17° 40' E.

Descending through oak timber.

3.50 Enter grainfield, bears E & W.

12.62 Intersected sec. line bet. secs. 3 and 10, 16.25 chs West of cor. to secs. 3, 10, 2 and 11. Also the NE cor. of Claim No. 48.

22.00 A gully, course South.

26.40 Days Creek, 20 lks wide, course W.

27.40 County road to Canyonville, course S.

32.00 Fate's house bears West.

40.00 SW. corner; I found here a basalt stone 8 x 7 ins. square, 4 ins. above ground, well buried, marked the same for corner 49. on top face, from which

A Wh. oak 20 ins. in diam. bears N 65° E, 104 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 4 W C. 49 BT. This is the old bearing tree, whose marks, being dim, I renew.

Thence, East on South boundary of Claim No. 49.

Va. 18° 45' E.

0.75 Leave road, enter field, and oak timber.

7.00 Along N. slope of hill.

13.00 Leave slope, level bottom.

16.00 Intersected sec. line bet. secs. 10 and 11, 11.60 chs. North of 1/4 sec. post.

18.00 A branch 1 lk. wide, course N.

28.50 Leave prairie, enter brush, begin ascent.

33.00 Top of rise, enter fir timber, begin descent.

37.06 SE. corner; A laurel post, marked C.49 probably set by the Co. Surveyor; the stump of a laurel, agreeing in size, bearing and distance between it and the post, according to the field notes furnished me, is standing. I replace the somewhat decayed post
