17.00	Leave grainfield, enter oak openings.
18.50	Leave field, enter inclosed pasture.
20.00	<p>Exterior angle corner; The post set for this corner is gone, but the bearing tree stands. I restore this corner by setting a cedar post, 4 1/2 ft. long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground, marked T 30 S. R 4 W C.49 on SE. face, from which</p> <p>A Wh. oak 20 ins. in diam. bears S. 25° E 29 lks. dist., marked T 30 S. R 4 W C.49 BT. This is the old bearing tree, whose marks, being dim, I renew.</p> <p>Thence, South on W. Boundary of Claim No. 49.</p> <p>Var. 18° 40' E</p>
