**CHAINS**

Claim No. 51 cont.

Set an oak post 4 1/2 ft. long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground, marked T 30 S. R 4 W. C.51 on NW. face, from which

A Wh. oak, 8 ins. in diam. bears S 77° W, 17 lks. dist., marked T 30 S. R 4 W C.51 B.T.

A Wh. oak, 10 ins. in diam. bears N 72° W. 39 lks. dist., marked T 30 S R 4 W Cl 51. B.T.

Thence, West on South boundary of Claim No. 51.

Va. 19° 5' E.

5.68 A White oak, 30 ins. in diam.

10.90 Right bank of S. Umpqua River, course N 80° W.

As the line follows now in the river (the river has trebled its width by washing the right bank), I make an offsett North of 5.00 chns.

31.00 Offset, South 3.00 chns to Right bank of river; true line lies in the river.

34.53 Intersect West line of Claim No. 51, 2.00 chns north of true SW. cor.; which is in the river; I set here as witness corner, a basalt rock, 15 x 10 x 6 ins. marked 51 W.C. on NE. face, in a mound of stone upon bedrock, from which

A Wh. oak, 36 ins. in diam. bears N 51.1/2° E. 520 lks. dist., marked T 30 S. R 4 W C.51 WC. B.T. This tree has been marked before as a bearing tree to this cor., but is erroneously called an Ash 30 ins. in diam. in the field notes, furnished me.

Thence, North on West boundary of Claim No. 51.

Var. 19° 5' E.

2.00 Right bank of S. Umpqua River, course N 80° W., enter low gravelly bottom, which is overflowed all winter.

5.00 Higher land, gravelly bottom, covered with oaks and fir, sparsely.

25.00 Enter corn patch, bears N. and S.

30.00 N.W. corner, and place of beginning.
