	From the cor. of secs. 13, 14, 23 and 24 I run
	North, on random line, bet. secs. 13 & 14.
40.00	Set tem. $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor.
80.00	Being unable, after diligent search, to find any trace of the corner of secs. 11, 12, 13 and 14, or any witnesses thereto belonging, I continue
	North on blank line bet. secs. 11 & 12.
120.00	At this point I make diligent search for but am unable to find any trace of the $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor.; set temp. cor.
160.00	At this point I again make search for but am unable to find any trace of the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11, and 12. I set a tem. cor. and go to the cor. of 12 and 13, on the E. bdy. of the Tp., which is an alder, 10 ins. in diam., properly marked and witnessed as per field notes furnished by the surveyor general.

	Thence I run
	N.0°34'E., on random E. line of Sec. 12, as per notes of same.
1.50	Leave clearing at top of ridge, c E. & W.
3.00	Trail, c NW. and SE.
7.50	Top of spur on line, c E.; steep descent.
15.50	A creek, 2 lks. wide, c N.20°W.
22.00	Trail, c S.20°E. and N.10°W.
23.40	A creek, 2 lks. wide, c NW.
33.50	Same creek, 2 lks. wide, c N.20°E.
36.00	Geo. West's house bears W., 2.50 chs.
38.00	Enter brushy marsh. <u>Offset E. 4.50 chs.</u> across marsh to blazed line, c N. and S.; thence north along said line.
44.00	A creek, 2 lks. wide, c W.; steep ascent.
47.50	Top of spur, c W.; steep descent.
49.25	A creek, 1 lk. wide, c W.
49.50	The $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor. on the E. bdy. of Sec. 12. Corner gone, witness trees standing and agree with notes of same
