

## Subdivisions of T. 20 S., R. 12 W.

CHAINS

- From this cor. the flag on S. side of lake bears S.4°30' E. and the distance over is 21.35 chs.
- 89.39 To point for cor. of secs. 1 and 12. Cor. in marsh, water (now) about 3 ft. deep.
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- The cor. of secs. 1 & 12 is in marsh.
- Beginning at the W.C., which is a post 168 lks. S.87°39' W. of the point for sec. cor. and heretofore described, I run
- S.87°39'W., along blazed line, bet. secs. 1 and 12.
- 1.68 W.C., the starting point on this line.
- Ascend SE. slope about 300 ft.
- 11.50 Top of spur, course S.; steep descent, about 300 ft.
- 15.90 Intersect E. shore of Lake Tsiltcoos, 30 lks. N. of meander cor. Corner and one witness tree gone. Reestablish the cor. from the witness standing.
- A fir tree, 8 ins. diam., which I mark M C on the E., T 20 S R 12 W on the W., S 1 on the N. and S 12 on the S. faces; from which
- A fir, 20 (now 40) ins. diam., bears S.14°E., 27 lks. dist.; markings partially obliterated (old witness tree).
- An alder, 24 ins. diam., bears N.10°W., 57 lks. dist., marked M C T 20 S R 12 W S 1 B T.
- To determine the distance across I set flag here and cross to W. shore, S.87°39'W. of flag; thence N.2°21'W., 2.12 chs. for base. Flag bears S.85°E. and the angle opposite is 7°21'; therefore, distance equals cotan. by base or  $7.77 \times 2.12 = 16.43$ . Course of line across lake is S.86°27'W.
- 32.33 W. shore. Being unable to find any cor. or witnesses at this point I establish a meander corner by setting a fir post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, marked M C on the W., T 20 S R 12 W on the E., S 1 on the N. and S 12 on the S. faces and from which
