 - Alder, 8 in. diam., bears N.69°W., 53 lks. dist.
 - A fir, 42 in. diam., bears S.60°W., 55 lks. dist.
 - A fir, 36 in. diam., bears S.30°E., 85 lks. dist.,
- which agrees with the field notes furnished by your office.

Thence I run

North, on line, between secs. 4 & 5.

22.00 Spring branch, 10 lks. wide, course SW.

40.00 Set $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. post bet. secs. 4 & 5; from which a

Fir tree, 36 in. dia., bears N.50°E., 17 lks.

A fir, 28 in. dia., bears S.78°E., 35 lks.

there being no tree on the west side convenient to the line.

From post for cor. of secs. 5, 6, 7, 8, I run

North, on line, between secs. 5 & 6.
