A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.15°W., dist. 80 lks.,  
marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.

Ascend.

72.00 Top of high ridge, course E.; descend.

80.00 On N. slope of hill, set post, 4 $\frac{1}{2}$  ft. long, 4 ins. sq.,  
24 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 11, 12, 13 and  
14, marked T 20 S Sec 12 on NE., R 10 W Sec 13 on SE.,  
Sec 14 on SW., Sec 11 on NW. faces, 4 notches on S. and  
1 on E. edges; from which a

marked T 20 S R 10 W Sec 12 B T.

Fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S.21°E., dist. 73 lks.,  
marked T 20 S R 10 W Sec 13 B T.

Hemlock, 12 ins. diam., bears S.54°W., dist. 90 lks.,  
marked T 20 S R 10 W Sec 14 B T.

Chittem, 4 ins. diam., bears N.64°W., dist. 80 lks.,  
marked T 20 S R 10 W Sec 11 B T.

From the cor. to secs. 11, 12, 13 and 14, I run  
E., on random line, bet. secs. 12 and 13.

40.00 Set temp.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.

80.29 Intersect E. bdy. of Tp., 43 lks. S. of cor. of secs. 12,  
13, 7 and 18.

15.00 Canyon, course SW.; ascend.

30.00 A hemlock, 24 ins. diam., on line, marked 2 notches on
