

Resurvey of Portion East Bdy., T. 20 S., R. 10 W.

CHAINS

(Old bearing tree) An alder, 16 ins. diam., bears N.61 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 37 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 9 W S 7 B T.

(New bearing tree) An alder, 12 ins. diam., bears S.69°E., 58 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 9 W S 18 B. T.

(New bearing tree) A vine maple, 6 ins. diam., bears S.10°W., 18 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 10 W S 13 B T.

(Old bearing tree) A fir, 45 ins. diam., bears N.30°W., 45 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 10 W S 12 B T.

East Bdy. of T. 19 S., R. 10 W., W. M.

From the NE. cor. of T. 20 S., R. 10 W., which is a post, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general, I run

North, on East bdy. of Sec. 36.

Descend through burnt timber & brush.

5.00 Ravine, 100 ft. below sec. cor., course W.; ascend.

9.30 On top of spur, 75 ft. above ravine, bears W. The old closing cor. of Tps. 19 & 20 S., R. 9 W.; I destroy this cor.

Descend 50 ft. to

11.00 Ravine, course SW.; ascend 200 ft. to

26.00 Summit of ridge, bears E. & W.; descend.

40.00 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., established on former survey, which is a cherry tree, 8 ins. diam., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 36 on W. side; from which

A cherry tree, 12 ins. diam., bears S.72°E., 35 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A cherry, 9 ins. diam., bears S.10°W., 10 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

62.55 North Fork of Smith River, 60 lks. wide, 300 ft. below
