CHAINS

The heads of 3 impassable canyons are in line; a prominent dead lone fir, easily identified, stands on opposite ridge in line. I lay off base due S. 1.00 ch. from which line tree bears N.87°50'E., making 26.45 chs. across.

30.86 To fir on rocky ridge; this is the highest point yet reached, giving a good view; ridge bears NW. and SE.; commence descent.

37.10 Spur, bears N. and S. -50

40.00 Set $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. post between secs. 33 and 4; from which
 A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.36 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W., 20 lks. dist.
 A fir, 12 in. in dia., bears N.46°E., 47 lks. dist.
 A high bald rocky cliff is south about 3 chs.

49.95 Fir, 30 in. dia.

52.50 Timber flat, bears N. & S. -100

57.50 Dry gulch, c NE.

62.45 Fir, 42 in. in dia. -20

65.25 Vincent Creek, 50 lks. wide, course N.; commence ascent. -100

77.05 Fir, 40 in. in dia.

80.00 Set post on flat spur, for corner to secs. 33, 34, 4 and 3; from which +40

A hemlock, 8 in. in dia., bears S.21°E., 36 lks. dist.

A hemlock, 15 in. in dia., bears N.46°E., 67 lks. dist.

A fir, 30 in. in dia., bears N.14°W., 46 lks. dist.

An alder, 16 in. in dia., bears S.63 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W., 67 lks. dist.
