23.40	A ravine and branch, 2 lks. wide, course NW.	
40.00	Set a post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. square, 12 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on W. face; from which <div style="margin-left: 40px;">A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.24<math>\frac{1}{2}</math>°W., 88 lks. dist., marked <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> S B T.  A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S.34°E., 28 lks. dist., marked <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> S B T.</div>	+50
42.40	A canyon, course W.; keep ascending.	+270
52.00	Leave green fir timber; enter burn.	
55.20	A cliff; enter green fir timber.	+100
55.75	Enter burnt timber.	
56.85	Top of dividing ridge, bears E. & W.; very steep descent of a rocky bluff.	+50
72.90	Smiths River, 150 lks. wide, course West.	
74.40	Enter cleared bottom.	
80.00	Set a post, 5 ft. long, 6 ins. square, with a marked stone, 24x10x8 ins., 12 ins. in the ground, for cor. to secs. 26, 27, 34, and 35, marked T 20 S S 26 on NE., R 9 W S 35 on SE., S 34 on SW., S 27 on NW. faces, with 1 notch on S. and 2 notches on E. edges; from which <div style="margin-left: 40px;">A maple, 14 ins. diam., bears S.55°W., 495 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 9 W S 34 B T.  and raised a mound of stone, 2 ft. high, 2 ft. base, alongside.</div>
