

Portion of S. Bdy. of T. 19 S., R. 9 W.

CHAINS

- Descend through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
- 1.32 The cor. secs. 1 and 2, T. 20 S., R. 9 W., which is a cedar tree, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.
- The markings referring to secs. on N. were obliterated at the time of my former survey.
- 29.55 Gold Creek, 12 lks. wide, 200 ft. below sec. cor., course S.; ascend gradually.
- 35.56 Creek, 4 lks. wide, course SW.
- 40.00 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. established on my former survey, which is a fir post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 36 on N. face; from which
- A fir, 25 ins. diam., bears S.37°E., 12 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
- A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N.70°W., 17 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
- 41.24 The old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. on N. bdy. of Sec. 1, T. 20 S., R. 9 W.
- 55.50 Top of spur, 200 ft. above Gold Creek, bears N.; descend 100 ft. to
- 63.20 Ravine, course N.; ascend 150 ft. to
- 74.50 Top of spur, brs. SE.; descend 100 ft. to
- 100.09 The closing cor. of Tps. 19 and 20 S., R. 9 W., which is a post, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.

- From the cor. of secs. 2 and 3, on N. bdy. of the Tp. West, retracing N. bdy. of T. 20 S., R. 9 W.
- 0.85 Intersect the cor. of secs. 34 and 35, T. 19 S., R. 9 W. Thence West, setting temp. cors. at intervals of 40.00 chs., making careful search, finding no evidence of line or corners, and topography does not agree with field notes.
