West Bdy. of T. 19 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

A cedar, 20 ins. diam., bears N.30°E., 32 lks. dist.,
marked T 19 S R 8 W S 18 B T.

A cedar, 24 ins. diam., bears S.70°E., 29 lks. dist.,
marked T 19 S R 8 W S 19 B T.

N. on W. boundary of Sec. 18.

Va. observed at 2 p.m. 20°10'E.

Descend.

- 2.00 Enter rocky bed of stream, 4 lks. wide, c S.10°W., some granite rocks; ascend along steep west side of canyon, through timber mostly deadened, very brushy.
- 14.50 Stream, 3 lks. wide, c E.
- 27.75 Slide canyon, c E.
- 28.25 Slide canyon, c SE.; ascend steep.
- 40.00 A fir, 14 ins. diam., which I mark for $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. cor., $\frac{1}{2}$ S on W. face; from which
A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N.60°E., 36 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T.
No tree convenient on W. side; dug pits, 18x18x12 ins., 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. W. of post; and raised mound of earth, 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. base, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, around post.
Continue to ascend rapidly.
- 51.75 Onto table land with green timber, rolling, rather open woods, sloping SW., watered on E. of line by a little branch, 1000 ft. above last sec. cor.
- 61.00 Leave table land; ascend steep.
Aug. 27th, '91.
- 70.50 Top of spur, c S.10°E.; continue to ascend along steep E. slope.
Va. at 8 a.m. observed to be 20°20'E.
- 80.00 500 ft. above table land, set post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in ground, for cor. to secs. 7 & 18, marked T 19 S R 8 W S 7 on NE., T 19 S R 8 W S 18 on SW. faces, with 2 notches on N. and 4 notches on S. edges; from which
