65.80 Trail to Eugene, in bend, bears NW. & SE. and NE. & SW.

68.00 Foot of descent, 150 ft. below spur; thence over bottom
land, bears NE. & SW.

75.50 N. fork of Smith River, 50 lks. wide, course SW.

79.74 The cor. of secs. 5, 6, 7 & 8.
