

Subdivisions of T. 19 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

Commence at the corner to Secs. 1, 2, 35 & 36, on the S. boundary of T. 19 S., R. 8 W., where finding only the burnt end of the original post, I set a new post, $4\frac{1}{2}$ ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in ground, marked T 19 S S 36 on NE., R 8 W S 1 on SE., T 20 S S 2 on SW., S. 35 on NW. faces, with 5 notches on West and 1 notch on E. edges; from which the original bearing trees bear as follows:

A fir, 12 ins. dia., bears N.42°E., 21 lks. dist., marked T 19 S R 8 W S 36 B T.

A fir, 8 ins. dia., bears S.41°E., 19 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 8 W S 1 B T.

A fir, 8 ins. dia., bears S.55°W., 47 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 8 W S 2 B T.

A fir, 10 ins. dia., bears N.77°W., 33 lks. dist., marked T 19 S R 8 W S 35 B T.

Thence I run N.1°W., bet. secs. 35 & 36.

Va. at 11 a.m. by solar observation, 20°35'E.

Ascend slightly in burnt fir timber and thick brush.

- .50 Top of spur, c NE.; thence along down West slope.
- 17.00 Creek bed, dry except in pools, c NE., about 300 ft. below spur; ascend.
- 25.00 Top of spur, running down E., 100 ft. above creek bed; descend.
- 29.75 To arm of a lake, c E. & W., 150 ft. below top of spur. Here set a flag and went around west end of said arm to line on N. side thereof at a fir, whence flag bears S.1°E.; ran west 1.00 ch. for base, whence flag brs. S.18 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., distance over by triangulation 3.00 chs.
- 32.75 Said fir, 40 ins. diam., on N. bank; thence in fine live timber; ascend.
- 40.00 Set post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on W. face; from which a maple, 14 ins. dia., bears S.60 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 4 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
