CHAINS

marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N. $3\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 42 lks. dist.,marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

44.00 Into narrow bottom, c N., 400 ft. below spur.

44.75 Ascend steep.

49.75 Top of ascent, 150 ft. up; thence along steep N. slope;
descend.

77.30 Enter bottom of Esmond Creek, 200 ft. down.

78.30 Enter Esmond Creek, 15 lks. wide, c S. 80° W.

79.60 To cor. to secs. 26, 27, 34 & 35.

Sept. 8th, 1891.

N. 2° W., bet. secs. 26 & 27.Va. $20^{\circ} 28'$ E. at 7 a.m.

3.00 Leave bottom of Esmond Creek; ascend.

19.25 Onto table land sloping gently S., about 300 ft. above
bottom.

27.75 Descend into little hollow, c E.

33.25 Onto ridge, c N. 10° E.40.00 Set post, 4 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in ground, for
 $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on W. face; from whichA fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 28° E., 63 lks. dist.,
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N. $16\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 120 lks. dist.,
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

45.75 Stream, 2 lks. wide, c W.

55.75 Divide bet. Esmond Creek & Siuslaw, c E. & W., about 600
ft. above bottom of Esmond Creek; thence down along
steep East side of a ridge, extending N. bet. Collins
and Larue Creeks.67.75 Onto said ridge, c N. 10° E.; thence along steep W. side
of same.80.00 Set post, 4 ft. long, 6 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground,
for cor. to secs. 22, 23, 26 & 27, marked T 19 S S 23
