94.60	Intersect N. bdy. Tp. line at a point 9.25 chs. W. of the old cor. to secs. 33, 34, 3 & 4, at which point of intersection I set a sandstone, 16x12x8 ins., 12 ins. in the ground, for closing cor. to secs. 3 & 4, marked C C with 3 notches on E. & W. faces; from which A maple, 30 ins. dia., bears S.18°E., 29 lks. dist., marked T 20 S R 7 W S 3 B T.
