V. $20\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E.

Along flat.

- 4.00 Descend 35° .
- 15.25 Branch, 3 lks. wide, flows W.; ascend 30° .
- 30.00 Cross ridge, E. & W.; descend 37° .
- 40.00 Set post, 4 ins. dia., 4 ft. long, with marked stone, 12 ins. in ground, for qr. sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{2}$ S on W. face; from which
- Hemlock, 8 ins. dia., bears N. 79° E., 30 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
- Cedar, 10 ins. dia., bears S. 82° W., 37 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
- 44.00 Cross branch, 3 lks. wide, flows West; ascend 31° .
- 80.00 Set post, 6 ins. dia., 4 ft. long, with marked stone, 12 ins. in ground, for cor. to secs. 15, 16, 21 & 22, marked T 21 S S 15 on NE., R 6 W S 22 on SE., S 21 on SW., S 16 on NW. face, with 3 notches on E. & S. edges; from which
- Fir, 24 ins. dia., bears N. 73° E., 30 lks. dist., marked T 21 S R 6 W S 15 B T.
- Fir, 24 ins. dia., bears S. 81° E., 24 lks. dist., marked T 21 S R 6 W S 22 B T.
- Fir, 12 ins. dia., bears S. 36° W., 12 lks. dist., marked T 21 S R 6 W S 21 B T.
- Fir, 30 ins. dia., bears N. 6° W., 56 lks. dist., marked T 21 S R 6 W S 16 B T.
