58 miles 77 chs. and 67 lks. of the subdivisions of this township run over mountainous land or through heavy timber or dense undergrowth.

General Description.

This township is generally mountainous and broken with level land along the streams also considerable level bench land.

The soil is a rich sandy loam 1st and 2nd rate and is very productive.

It is well watered by numerous springs and streams.

The timber consists principally of fir, hemlock, cedar alder and maple of an excellent quality for manufacturing purposes.

Forest fires have destroyed nearly all the timber in Secs. 7, 8, 9, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20 and 21.

There are two settlers in Section 3.
