A Cedar, 60 ins. diam., bears S.27*E., 66 lks. dist. A Double Cedar, 30 ins. diam., bears N.44*E., 59 lks. dist. No tree SW near. Land, mountainous and 3rd rate. 40.00	Set for ¼ Sec. post a rock, 24 ins. x24x16 in middle of rocky canyon, above the forks of two canyons, from which A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.76*E., 62 lks. dist. A Chittenwood, 3 ins. diam., bears W. 3 lks. dist.	
42.00	Leave canyon, begin ascending East slope.	-100
56.50	Top of perpendicular bluff, 60 ft. high; begin descent.	+150
64.00	Wasson Creek, course W 60 lks. wide, line crosses creek on a Fir tree 48 ins. diam., which has probably lain there a hundred years.	-300
