

RESURVEY PORTION WEST BOUNDARY T. 21 S., R. 10 W.

CHAINS

is a stone, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General. Alongside the old cor. set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 8 ins. in the ground, surrounded by a mound of stone, with brass cap marked

Land, mountainous.

Soil, dark damp gravelly loam; 3rd rate.

Timber, Fir, Cedar, Alder and Chittem.

Undergrowth, Huckleberry, Rhododendron, Salmonberry and Vinemaple.

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RETRACEMENTS

From the cor. of Secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34, on the N. bdy. of The Tp., East retracing the line bet. Secs. 3 and 34; at 40.00 chs. find no trace of the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor., set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor., and at 78.97 chs. fall 3.12 chs. S of the cor. of Secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35. The length and bearing of this line is N.87*44'E., 79.03 chs.

East, retracing the line bet. Secs. 2 and 35; at 36.25 chs. fall 33 lks. N. of the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor., and at 75.12 chs. fall 139 lks. S. of the cor. of Secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36. The length and course of the $W\frac{1}{2}$ of this line is S.89*29'E., 36.25 chs. and the $E\frac{1}{2}$ is N.87*28'E., 38.91 chs.

East, retracing the line bet. Secs. 1 and 36; at 42.47 chs. fall 2 lks. N of the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor., and at 78.87 chs. fall 27 lks. S of the cor. of Tps. 20 S., Rs. 9 and 10 W. The course and length of the $W\frac{1}{2}$ of this line is S.89*58'E., 42.47 chs. and the $E\frac{1}{2}$ is N.89*33'E., 36.40 chs.

From the cor. of Tps. 20 S., Rs. 9 and 10 W. East, retracing the line bet. Secs. 1 and 31 and at 20.63 chs. fall 29 lks. S of the point for closing cor. of Tps. 21 S., Rs. 9 and 10 W. The course and length of this line is N.89*12'E., 20.63 chs.

I commence at the cor. of Secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34, the point for which is located by reference to the old NE and NW bearing trees, which are dead and badly
