CHAINS

the old SE and SW bearing trees and alongside the old post set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. of Secs. 35 and 36, with brass cap marked

Ascend gradually 15 ft. to

A Hemlock, 10 ins. diam., bears S.53*E., 25 lks. dist., marked T 21 S R 10 W S 1 B T.

A Hemlock, 28 ins. diam., bears S.55*W., 22 lks. dist., marked T 21 S R 10 W S 2 B T.

Land, mountainous and nearly level.

Soil, shallow sandy loam and vegetable mold; 3rd and 4th rate.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Cedar, Alder and Maple.

Undergrowth, Huckleberry, Salmonberry, Vinemaple, Rhododendron and Salal.

S.89*58'E., resurveying the N Bdy. of Sec. 1.

Along S slope, thru heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

10.00 Descend gradually on SE slope 330 ft. to

33.00 Stream, 9 lks. wide, course N.80*E; ascend steep NW slope.
