Land, mountainous.
Soil, shallow light loam; 2nd rate.
Timber, Fir, Alder, Cedar and Hemlock.
Undergrowth, Huckleberry, Fern, Salal, Rhododendron,
Vinemaple, Lilac and Manzanita.
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- S.0*01'E., on a random line, bet. Secs. 34 and 35.
- 40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. corner.
- 88.70 Intersect S bdy. of the Tp., 13 lks. E of the corner of
