A Cedar, 48 ins. diam., bears S.68*W., 53 lks.
dist., marked T 21 S R 10 W S 22 B T (New B.T.)

A Cedar, 48 ins. diam., bears N.56*W., 50 lks.
dist., marked T 21 S R 10 W S 15 B T (Old B.T.)

From this corner

N.2*54'W., resurveying the W bdy. of Sec. 23.

Descend N slope 25 ft. to

4.31 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in
the ground, for cor. of Secs. 14 and 23, with brass
cap marked

Land, mountainous.

Soil, shallow sandy loam and exposed rock; 1st and
4th rate.

Timber, Fir, Cedar and Hemlock.

Undergrowth, Salmonberry, Huckleberry, Salal, Vinemaple,
Alder and Thimbleberry.

East, on a random line, bet. Secs. 14 and 23.

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. corner.

80.10 Intersect N and S line, 7 lks. N of the cor. of Secs.
13, 14, 23 and 24.

Thence

N.89*57'W., on a true line, bet. Secs. 14 and 23.

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense
undergrowth, descending NW slope 465 ft. to creek.
