- 18.60 Trail, bears NE and SW.
- 21.25 Wasson Creek, 90 lks. wide, course SW; ascend SE slope  
185 ft. to
- 27.50 Top of spur, slopes SW; descend gradual W slope 35 ft.  
to  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. corner.
- 36.20 Stream, 5 lks. wide, course SE; continue gradual descent.
- 40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in  
the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. corner, with brass cap marked
